## You help families Make Way for Kindergarten

*A new program to ensure children and families transition successfully to school*



Did you know that children who enter kindergarten with basic math and literacy skills are more likely to succeed academically, go further in school, and find secure jobs as adults. Being ready for kindergarten matters!

**Because of you, we have the chance to create innovative programs that ensure children in our community are ready to read and succeed!** Make Way for Kindergarten is part of our Neighborhood School Readiness Project that began in Fall of 2014 with the generous support of The Helios Education Foundation. Make Way for Kindergarten teaches children the skills they need to thrive in Kindergarten. Through focus groups with local Kindergarten teachers, we determined which skills teachers want their new students to have when they begin kindergarten.

Your support means families receive books and literacy resources like Ready4K! Families in Make Way for Kindergarten receive Ready4K! text messages through our partnership with Stanford University. Ready4K! sends texts to help families maximize regular family routines and help prepare young children for kindergarten.

**With your support, Make Way for Kindergarten is helping children develop the specific skills that teachers want them to have on the first day of school.** Children and families learn about what they can expect in Kindergarten, from daily routines to how to communicate with new school staff. Parents gain the knowledge, resources, and confidence they need to support and advocate for their children in school.

## You help us reach families in rural communities

**Families learn together at a Family Literacy Event in Ajo, Arizona and children have fun trying on glasses while enjoying a storytime featuring the book *Arlo Needs Glasses*.**

Sometimes meeting children and families where they are means traveling hours to provide family literacy events, professional development workshops, create book collections at preschools, and more!

Your support enables us to travel to rural communities like Arivaca, Three Points, Ajo, and Amado to provide high-quality programming, support, and books through The Story Project. The project provides coaching and workshops that build the confidence, knowledge, and resources of early childhood professionals in providing meaningful early literacy and language support for children in their care. **This year, 99% of educators gained strategies they can use to better support children and families!**

Because of supporters like you, we provided Family Literacy Events that connect parents and children with literacy resources. Your support has allowed us to provide books in languages such as Spanish, Navajo, Tohono O'odham, and Hopi. By working closely with educators and families, we are able to select books that ensure that children see their own

cultures and language reflected in stories. Families are empowered to share books in their home language. Lending libraries, a valuable resource for families, are established in these communities to allow families to easily check out these books to share at home. One parent shared, **"This program is important because it develops my child's knowledge, greater imagination, and language development."**

According to Eleanor Droegemeier, the former regional director for the First Things First Pima South Regional Partnership Council, The Story Project is building a connection between educators and families, **"The presence of Make Way for Books in these rural communities has provided an exciting opportunity for early childhood professionals to enhance their knowledge of effective practices that support early language and literacy development, but almost as importantly, it has provided a vehicle for engaging and connecting the families of young children to early education programs and other available resources."**


